NEW STUDENT &TRANSITION PROGRAMS

Our goal is to ensure that all new UCLA students and their families begin their journeys at UCLA with a comprehensive and positive introduction to Bruin Life. This includes academic advising, educational planning, and course enrollment.

New Parent & Family Orientation is one-day long and designed to address the questions and concerns of family members about UCLA. **Your student should attend a New Student Orientation session.**

The day includes an opening address and presentations on UCLA's academic degree and educational opportunities, university services, campus safety, and the student experience. The presentations are given by professionals from across the university.

New Parent & Family Orientation activities are held separately from the student session and welcome family members of both first year and transfer students, and most coincide with the first day of a First-Year New Student Orientation session. New Parent & Family Orientation session 301 will be held on a Saturday. This session does not correspond with a specific First-Year New Student Orientation session and is open to any parents and family members that would prefer to attend a session on a weekend.

YOUNG BRUINS

In order to make the New Parent & Family Orientation experience enjoyable for all family members, we offer activities for children ages 5-17 as part of the scheduled day's program. If you plan to bring children with you to your New Parent & Family Orientation session, please be sure to include their names and ages on your reservation.

Families who wish to have their children participate in the Young Bruins session will be required to sign a waiver of liability at the beginning of the session.

NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION POLICY

New Student Orientation is mandatory for all new first-year and transfer undergraduate students. Failure to register for orientation by July 1, 2025 will result in a hold on your student's record preventing course registration. At orientation, your student will connect with other new students, learn about the campus and many of the services available to Bruins, meet with academic advisors, enroll in their first college classes, and much more. There are many different orientation sessions for students to choose from, including sessions dedicated for out-of-state and international students. Your student can register for any session as course availability is equitable across all orientation sessions.

RIGHT TO PRIVACY

BRUIN TO BRUIN PROJECT (B2B)

New Bruins can join current students in Zoom sessions throughout the Spring to review important tasks to complete for a smooth transition, as well as begin connecting students to our community. Please encourage your student to sign up and attend. B2B will run May to mid-June.
